

MISCELLANEOUS NOTICES

CIVIL RIGHTS

Titles VI & VII of the Civil Rights Act prohibit discrimination of federally funded programs on the basis of sex, race, color, religion or national origin. The Individuals with Disabilities Education Act requires the District to find and serve qualified students with disabilities residing in the District.

SCHOOL INSURANCE

Weber School District offers a voluntary student accident insurance plan underwritten by Security Life Insurance Company. This plan offers a cost-effective alternative for families who need insurance. This insurance offers several enrollment options designed to fit your individual needs. It is a supplemental accidental bodily injury insurance. You may enroll anytime by contacting the head secretary at the school.

TITLE IX

Weber School District complies with Title IX regulation: “No person in the United States shall on the basis of sex, be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits or, or be subject to discrimination under any educational program or activity receiving federal financial assistance. Problems should be referred to the school administration.”

SPECIAL ACCOMMODATIONS FOR MEETINGS

In compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act, individuals needing special accommodations (including auxiliary communicative aids and services) during any school meeting or activity should notify the principal at least three (3) working days prior to the meeting.

ASBESTOS

“Federal regulations require that schools be inspected for the presence of asbestos, a toxic material that has been used in the construction industry for a number of years. This school has been inspected for asbestos containing materials and the results of the inspections are contained in the Asbestos Management Plan. The Asbestos Management Plan is available for your preview at each school, the District Office, or a copy of the plan would be provided to you for the cost of reproduction.”

WEBER SCHOOL DISTRICT INTEGRATED PEST MANAGEMENT

Weber School District is committed to providing a clean, safe environment for students, staff and the public. To help accomplish this and in accordance with Utah Admin. Code R392-200-7(12), we have adopted an Integrated Pest Management (IPM) program to manage pests on school district property. The IPM approach minimizes the exposure of students, staff and the public to pesticides, pests of health concern, and uses a variety of non-chemical and chemical methods to prevent and manage pests.

CHILDREN AND YOUTH WITH DISABILITIES (Section 504 ADA)

It is the policy of the Board of Education of Weber School District to provide a free appropriate education to each student with disabilities within its jurisdiction. It is the intent of the district to ensure that students who are disabled within the definition of Section 504 of the Americans with Disabilities Act are identified, evaluated, and provided with necessary accommodations for the appropriate educational services. Due process rights of disabled students and their parents under Section 504 are guaranteed in Weber School District. Our staff is available to assist you in understanding your rights and is available on request to provide you with any further explanation of these rights, as needed. It is the parent’s responsibility to advise the School District of any known needs for a disabled student.

DIRECTORY INFORMATION WITHHOLD RELEASE REQUEST

Directory information, which is information that is generally not considered harmful of an invasion of privacy if released, may be released at the discretion of school officials, without consent, for appropriate reasons such as, school publications, newspaper articles, and to outside education related organizations. In addition, two federal laws require secondary schools to provide military recruiters, upon request, the names, addresses and telephone listings of their students.

The items listed below are designated as “directory information” by the Weber School District and may be released for appropriate reasons at the discretion of your child’s school. [UCA §§ 53A-13-301, et seq.] Under the provisions of the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974, as amended, you have the right to withhold the release of the information listed below:

- Student’s name
- Student’s telephone number
- Participation in officially recognized activities and sports
- Degrees and awards received
- Photograph
- Student’s address
- Date of birth
- Weight and height of members of athletic teams
- Most recent educational institution attended by the student
- Yearbook, school newspaper, school newsletter, social media, community newsletters

Please consider very carefully your decision to withhold any item of “directory information.” Should you decide to inform your child’s school not the release directory information, any future requests for such information from individual or entities not affiliated with the Weber School District will be refused.

IMMUNIZATION

Effective July 1, 1992, the Utah State Immunization Law mandates that student immunization records must be complete and on file at the time of registration in order for a student to attend school. Principals are not permitted to enroll pupils who are not in compliance. A grace period will no longer be allowed. Any person claiming an exemption to immunization shall complete the official Utah School Immunization Record with the required signatures which must be obtained from the Weber County Health Department and/or the family physician. If you have questions concerning the immunizations, please contact the school nurse.

Utah Code 53A-11-301-3 Immunization Requirements

Students entering 7th grade must have:

- 1 Tdap vaccine (Tetanus, Diphtheria/acellular Pertussis) regardless of the interval since the last Td (Tetanus/Diphtheria) containing vaccine.
- 2 Measles, Mumps, Rubella (MMR)
- 3 Hepatitis B
- 2 Hepatitis A
- 2 Varicella (Chickenpox)
- Meningitis (Meningococcal)
- 4 Polio (3 doses, if 3rd dose was given on/after the 4th birthday)
- 5DTaP/DT (4doses of DTaP, if 4th dose given on/after the 4th birthday)

If a student has had chickenpox, parent must sign verification statement on school immunization record. For 2016-2017 school year only, students entering Kindergarten, 1st, 7th and 8th grade are required to have two doses of the varicella (chickenpox) vaccine. Students in all other grades are required to have one dose of the varicella (chickenpox) vaccine.

ONLINE COURSES

Students can now take online courses through Weber Online. These courses are taught by Weber School District teachers and are offered at no cost to Weber District Students. For information regarding Weber Online, talk to your school counselor or visit the website: <http://weberonline.wsd.net/>

SCHOOL CHOICE CONDITION

Students who wish to attend a school in the Weber School District other than their home school (“non-resident school”) must complete and return the proper application form to the requested school during the open enrollment window (December 1st to the 3rd Friday in February). This window will be the only period that “option” registration will be authorized. Special needs may be reviewed without regard to the general guidelines. Forms are available from the schools or the District Office.

LOCKER AGREEMENT

Lockers are the property of the school district and may be inspected at any time by school authorities. It is the student’s responsibility to use only the assigned locker and to keep the combination confidential. Money or other valuables should never be left in a locker. Inappropriate decorations, stickers, or suggestive pictures are not allowed. A fee can be assessed to change a locker combination, and any damage to a locker will be the financial responsibility of the student.

JUNIOR HIGH VISION AND SCOLIOSIS TESTING NOTIFICATION

A vision screening will be given for all 7th grade and 9th grade students and all students 7th – 9th grade will participate in a scoliosis screening at some time during the year. If you do not want your child to participate in these screenings, please notify the school nurse in writing.
